After detail discussions and site visit, the proponent agreed and consented to furnish the following information:-

1. Written statement from the competent authority to the effect that the institute does not generate any Radio Active Waste in their clinical and/or research blocks.
2. Submit the details of total number of trees standing at the project site as well as the total number of trees proposed to be felled with permission from the competent authority granted at the proposed construction site.
3. Submit complete details of plantation of project site and the compensatory plantation in lieu of trees to be felled from the project site. The write-up in the annexure V of the letter may be amended accordingly.
4. At the time of site visit, two project sites which were once part of thick green belt maintained by the forest department and now in possession of the proponent ^{by one person} are supporting dense growth of trees of different age groups. It seems that trees of this area are not enumerated. The proponent may please ensure that whether the trees of this area are enumerated and form the part of figure 21625 trees or not, as indicated in the documents submitted to the EAC.
5. The NOC from the Chief Fire Officer may be supplied as and when granted by the concerned CFO.
6. In compliance with the MoEF, New Delhi circular J-11013/41/2006-IA,II (I) Part, dated 19 May 2011, the institute needs to have a well laid down Environment Policy, duly approved by the Board of Directors. The policy should consist of standards operating norms/procedures to bring into focus any infringement/ deviation / violation etc and the hierarchical system or administrative order to deal with the environmental issues, for ensuring compliance with EC conditions as well as Environment (Protection) Act 1986 and rules issued there under.
7. Since as already pointed out, there are violations as per the EIA Notifications, It is, therefore, requested that the matter relating to violations, be put up to the Board of Directors of the Institute for consideration of its environment related policy/plan of action as also a written formal commitment in the form of formal resolution be submitted to the effect that violation of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 etc. will not be repeated in future, in view of the MoEF, New Delhi Letter dated 16.11.2010.

II. M/S MIRAGE INFRA LTD FOR ITS COMMERCIAL COMPLEX "ACROPOLIS", PLOT NO. 68, INDUSTRIAL AREA, PHASE - II, CHANDIGARH.

The committee also visited the site of above proponent on 09.06.2012 at 10:30 A.M. and it was found that the proponent has constructed the frame work of Ground Floor plus 3 floor without having environment clearance. The proponent has violated the provisions of EIA notification.


